






Driving better recycling outcomes




Strong community engagement



\$1.6million dollars in donations

- Weekly calls from farmers and rural communities in need
- Media coverage: The Project (Ch10), The Daily Telegraph, Australian Women's Weekly, Sunrise (Ch7) and a meeting with Prime Minister Scott Morrison



St Augustine's College: Sustainability journey



Implementation

- Identifying the problem;
- Educating students during assembly days;
- Delegating responsibilities/volunteers;
- Infrastructures and War on Waste display;
- Liaise with canteen, cleaners, teachers, students and parents;
- What to do with the funds?
- Goals: reduce our plastic use, recycle the bottles sold at the college with Return and Earn



St Augustine's College: fundraising for 'A Fiver for a Farmer'



- Dedicated Return and Earn donation stations to fundraise for 'A Fiver for a Farmer'
- Peer to peer collaboration and support to charities
- Improved awareness about recycling and correct disposal behaviours
- Increased funds for sustainability school programs and 'A Fiver for a Farmer'
- More sustainable living and decrease in school waste collection fees
